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Diploma Student Guidelines

The Diploma of Theological Studies is designed for students who are considering theological discipline and who seek a basic foundation in religious education. It also provides an increased and concentrated exposure to the nature and principles of the Christian faith and certain areas of church work.

This program enables persons of all levels of training and expertise to expand their insight and perspective in biblical studies and/or ministry.

Program

Diploma Program – This program is designed to provide all church workers and leaders with a general knowledge of the background and message of the Bible. In addition, this program serves as an acquaintance with the nature, purpose and methodology of the many areas of church work. Completion of this program may be achieved in two years of designated class work.

Objectives

1. To help Church leaders better understand the basic principles and tenets of the Christian faith.
2. To help Church leaders develop and cultivate skills in fulfilling their respective ministries.
3. To help Church leaders develop self-confidence in their Christian witness.
4. To help Church leaders better understand the nature, purpose and ministries of the church.
5. To help Church leaders develop contemporary methods of ministry.

Registration

Any student who has acquired a high school diploma, GED or equivalent may register for the Diploma Program

Fees

The registration fee, textbook fees, and a percentage of the tuition cost per course taken, must accompany the application for each student at the beginning of the semester. The balance must be paid before the mid-term examination of the semester.

Class Requirements/Attendance Policy

Full attendance is required of all students. A student is never excused from the work of the class. Unexcused absences will impact your grades. It is understood that absences allowed must provide for illness and other emergency reasons. During inclement weather follow Greenville County School policy.

All classes are to meet one hour thirty minutes per week for thirteen weeks or more. Final examination is given the final week.

Grading

The grades for the Diploma Program are indicated by the symbols: “A”, “B”, “C,” “D”, “F”, “I”, “W”, and “WV”.

A = 90 - 100

B = 80 - 89

C = 70 - 79

D = 60 - 69

F = Below 60

I = incomplete. The student did not complete some phase of his/her work, such as turning in written papers, taking examination etc.

W = Withdrew

WV = Course waived

Incomplete work must be made up by the end of the semester following the term in which the course was taken. Failure to do so will result in the grade of “F”. Any student with a failing grade of “F” must repeat the course to fulfill requirements.

Records And Transcripts

The school office will maintain records of each student enrolled in the respective courses. The record will include: semester date, course name, grade, and instructor. Grades are mailed at the end of the semester. There is a fee for copies of transcripts.

Candidates For Graduation

Names and addresses of all prospective candidate for May awards must be in the registrar’s office on or before the first Monday in April. This information must be typed and double checked for the correct spelling of names, as they will appear on Diplomas. No changes will be accepted after the receipt of the official roster. All grades and fees must be received before an award is issued to a candidate.
